Senior Forest Officer (Planning)

The primary role of this position is to manage employee and contractor safety while achieving commercial and environmental targets in the delivery of regional wood production plans. This position works closely with Harvesting, Sales and Roding teams.

You will need highly developed project management and planning skills and be able to develop strong working relationships with internal and external stakeholders. Applications that demonstrate knowledge of commercial forestry practices, logging principles and operations including safety, environment protection and contract management will be highly regarded. The successful applicant will be required to complete and maintain the Forest Practices Officer (Planning) accreditation.

Position Accountabilities and Selection Criteria

- Experience in providing leadership to a small team to ensure targets are met within agreed safety and environmental standards
- Oversee staff and contractor safety compliance in accordance with work health and safety legislation, procedures, contractual arrangements and plans to achieve corporate safety goals
- Experience in applying and auditing forest management functions, methods and processes to meet operational compliance obligations
- Knowledge of relevant Codes of Practice, regulations, Australian Standards (or equivalent as appropriate)
- Develop and implement strategic tactical and operational plans to achieve wood supply to contractual commitments

SFO Planning

- Prepare, certify and implement Forest Practices Plans
- Develop and maintain key relationships with STT Harvesting, Sales and Roding teams and external regulatory bodies e.g. Forest Practices Authority
- Monitor and report on compliance with relevant Acts, Regulations and certification requirements and rectify non-conformance
- Ability to successfully complete the Forest Practices Officer qualifications/course

Desirable Qualifications

Forest Practices Officer qualifications/course or its replacement as required

Australasian Inter-service Incident Management System (AIIMS) or its replacement as required

Relevant industry qualification or demonstrated experience in a similar position
